- 1 This document lists the projects or types of development that will be, or may be, wholly or partly funded from the Community Infrastructure Levy in Mole Valley.
- The list is published pursuant to Regulation 123 of the Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations. Its purpose is to avoid duplication between the Community Infrastructure Levy and the use of Section 106 obligations to secure infrastructure to support new development. In accordance with Regulation 123, contributions towards infrastructure listed in this document will not be sought through Section 106 obligations, except in the case of the listed exclusions.
- Inclusion on the list does not guarantee funding will be available for the stated types of development. Decisions on priority and timing of funding will be decided by Mole Valley District Council under corporate governance arrangements. The list is not in any order of priority.
