Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The restaurant will promote the licensing objectives by operating a comprehensive CCTV system, enforcing a strict Challenge 25 age verification policy, and ensuring all staff are trained in responsible alcohol sales and conflict management. Alcohol will only be served to customers dining on the premises. An incident and refusals log will be maintained and reviewed regularly. Regular fire and safety checks will be carried out, and all equipment and emergency exits will be properly maintained. Noise levels will be managed, customers will be encouraged to leave quietly, and deliveries will take place at reasonable hours to minimise disturbance. Outdoor dining and smoking areas will be supervised, and the premises will remain clean, safe, and family-friendly. Children will be permitted only when accompanied by an adult, and all safeguarding measures will be strictly observed.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Implement a CCTV system covering all entry/exit points and key areas, recording continuously with footage kept for at least 28 days.

Ensure staff are trained in conflict management, responsible alcohol sales, and how to identify fake IDs.

Operate a Challenge 25 policy, requiring ID for anyone who appears under 25.

Maintain a refusals and incident log, to record any issues involving alcohol refusal, disorderly conduct, or police involvement.

Employ SIA-licensed door staff (if appropriate) during busy periods or late hours.

Work closely with local police and community safety partnerships.

c) Public safety

Conduct and regularly update a fire risk assessment and maintain clear fire exits, signage, and extinguishers.

Train staff in emergency procedures, including evacuation and first aid.

Ensure adequate lighting both inside and outside the premises.

Maintain all electrical installations, gas appliances, and equipment with regular safety inspections.

Monitor capacity limits to avoid overcrowding.

Provide safe drinking water and clearly signpost restrooms and exits.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Control noise levels through soundproofing, appropriate music volume, and by keeping doors and windows closed when entertainment is taking place.

Display "Please leave quietly" signs at exits to encourage respectful behaviour.

Manage waste disposal responsibly, ensuring bottles and rubbish are not disposed of late at night.

Schedule deliveries and waste collections during reasonable hours.

Monitor outdoor areas (e.g., smoking areas) to prevent disturbance to nearby residents.

Use noise limiters if hosting live or recorded music.

e) The protection of children from harm

Enforce a strict Challenge 25 age verification policy with acceptable forms of ID (passport, driving licence, PASS card).

Train staff on underage sales laws and procedures for dealing with suspected underage customers.

Do not permit unaccompanied children in the premises after a set time.

Ensure any entertainment or events are age-appropriate.

Keep alcoholic products out of reach in retail settings and clearly separate from non-alcoholic goods.

Report and cooperate with authorities on any child safeguarding concerns.

 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
