IMPORTANT CHANGES TO YOUR RECYCLING

Simpler Recycling is here.

You can now recycle a wider range of items at home such as rinsed out food and drink cartons (Tetra Paks) and empty aerosols. These can now be added to your dry mixed recycling bin. Other new items you can also recycle include: squeezable metal tubes such as the type used for tomato puree; squeezable plastic tubes such as toothpaste and cosmetics tubes and non-black plastic plant pots.

Being able to recycle more items is positive news – for the planet and your pocket. Recycling is the most environmentally friendly and cost-effective method the council can use to process waste – and any savings can be put towards other essential services that benefit the community.

OTHER TOP THINGS TO KNOW

Recycle Right

Hidden batteries pose a fire risk for bin trucks and recycling stations. Protect our crews and recycle your batteries separately. Do not put hazardous waste such as engine oil or paint in your rubbish bin. Get the right bin every time by using the Surrey Recycles search tool

Vapes and e-cigarettes

These can't go in your rubbish or recycling bins. For disposal details visit molevalley.gov.uk

Bulky waste

For a fee we will collect some household appliances, white goods and furniture if you are unable to recycle them. Applies to residential properties only. Find out more at molevalley.gov.uk

Surrey Recycles

Thank you for recycling – Surrey Environment Partnership's target recycling rate for Surrey is **65%** by 2035. The latest recycling rate for Mole Valley is **56.4%**. Find out more at surreyep.org.uk
